that [he/she] may be restored to health.


If that is not Your will dear Father,

Answering Your Questions Regarding Anointing



Anointing

James 5:13-16 Is any one of you in trouble? He should pray. Is anyone happy? Let him sing songs of praise. Is any one of you sick? He should call the elders of the church to pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise him up. If he has sinned, he will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective. (NIV)

What is an anointing?

The Bible describes three different types of anointing. After bathing, people anointed themselves with oil for **beautification**. When a priest, king, or prophet began his ministry, he was anointed with oil for **consecration**.

(Priests and sanctuary furnishings were anointed with oil mixed with spices, Ex. 30:2-25). The word “Christ” or “Messiah” means “Anointed One”. Quoting from Isa. 61, Jesus claimed He was anointed of God, not only to preach to the poor, but also to heal the broken hearted, to give the oil of joy for their mourning. Oil was also used **medicinally**, for example the Balm of Gilead in Jer. 8:22, 46:11, 51:8. When Jesus sent the disciples out to preach the gospel, they also cast out demons and anointed the sick with oil (Mark 6:13).

When is an anointing appropriate?

It is appropriate to request an anointing whenever one is sick (spiritually, emotionally, physically, etc.) Anointing is not for extreme illnesses only. Nor is it for times when everything else has been tried and failed.

It is appropriate for one to request anointing when one wants to be dedicated for service or ministry.

Who can be anointed?

Any Christian who (1) believes that God “is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him” (Heb 11:6) and (2) needs any type of healing, can be anointed.

Why is oil used during an anointing?

Oil is one of the Biblical symbols of the Holy Spirit. Olive oil is the most common oil used during Bible times.

How should one prepare for an anointing?

James 5:16 connects confession of sin and healing. Privately confess your sins

before God and reaccept His gift of eternal life. If you are “at odds” with anyone, make it right before the anointing. In other words, make sure you are right with God and others before the anointing.

Will I have to disclose why I'm requesting an anointing?

You don't have to give details. However, you should give enough information so the person(s) doing the anointing knows how best to pray.

What will happen during the anointing?

You will be introduced to those participating in the anointing. You will be asked what you want healed or how it is you desire God's Spirit to strengthen and bless you in His service. Participants might share Bible promises or experiences with you. Next, people pray for you (sometimes placing their hand upon you) and one anoints you with oil. Usually the person doing the anointing places a small amount of oil upon your forehead.

If I request anointing for healing, how can I know if I have been healed?

God wants to heal you! However, He will only heal you when it is best for you. In spite of our preferences, God might heal us either instantly, gradually, through medical means, or at the Second Coming. If one is seeking spiritual healing, as soon as a person requests such, assuming they believe, they are healed spiritually. “If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.” 1 John 1:9.
