

Five Dynamic Acts that will Transform Your Church

- 1 **Be a praying Leader.** Set an example for your congregation. Find a prayer partner. Instead of being self-motivated you will be “God motivated” and driven by His passion for people.”
- 2 **Give your Church members a strong Biblical understanding of who God is and how they can relate to Him personally.** Find ways to help your congregation experience who God is. And find ways that their relationships with others and with God will improve because they connect to a personal God.
- 3 **Help your congregation develop a strong devotional prayer life and commitment to pray for others in and among the members of your Church and community.** Encourage every member to become a praying member. Spending time in God’s presence produces unity, humility, purity,
- 4 **Develop and demonstrate different ways that prayer can become a way of life for your church. Keep prayer from becoming an isolated program.** Encourage every ministry in your church to become actively involved in prayer, seek first, God’s plans for your ministry and for the many ministries that He wants to develop among your congregation. (Your plans may not be God’s plans.) God’s plans always succeed. Church-Board meetings will be prayer filled and Holy Spirit directed.
- 5 **Incorporate frequent opportunities for corporate prayer.** Make it a precedence for the spiritual life of your Church. It will bring healing and unity to church Members and power for all the ministries in your church outreach programs.
